Dear Barbara,

Since January, our team has answered a record-breaking number of emergency requests. We <u>answered an urgent call</u> from Boston Health Care for the Homeless Program within 4 hours, sending winter coats, fleece layers, hats, and gloves to protect 150 patients from the arctic air blast in Boston's cold emergency. Our volunteer drivers have made more than 25 deliveries to our partner shelters, clinics, schools, and programs to make sure no one is left out in the cold unprotected.

Your generous support has fueled the expansion of Circle of Hope's Emergency Response Program, helped us launch a new pilot partnership with the Mary Eliza Mahoney House for families experiencing homelessness at the Dimock Center, and enabled us to start serving families in scattered site shelters throughout MetroWest. We gave thousands of infants, children, and adults experiencing homelessness the clothing and hygiene essentials they needed for dignity, agency, physical and mental health last year. New Pilot Partnership with the Mary Eliza Mahoney House Emergency Family Shelter



We are proud to announce Circle of Hope's new pilot partnership with the Dimock Center's Mary Eliza Mahoney House, an emergency family shelter in Roxbury. We provide clothing and hygiene essentials for families who have experienced trauma and receive no other supports for basic needs.

The day after our December delivery, we got a call from Maggie, the Program Director, about a family that just arrived with nothing but what they were wearing and their infant wrapped in a blanket. Within 48 hours, two shelter staff arrived at Circle of Hope and picked up new winter clothes, coats, and essentials for the family, as well as a porta-crib so the baby had a safe place to sleep.

We're proud to meet the urgent needs of families experiencing homelessness through this impactful new pilot partnership!

Donation Guidelines and COVID-19 Policy

Donation Guidelines

We accept new and gently used donations by appointment from 10am - 12pm on Monday - Thursday. <u>Schedule your appointment</u> and drop off new or gently used donations any time during your two-hour donation window. **Please bag your new and gently used donations separately** and



label each bag "new" or "gently used." We will accept **up to 3 paper grocery bags or white kitchen trash bags of gently used clothing** per appointment; there is no bag limit for new donations.

COVID-19 Policy

Anyone entering Circle of Hope must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and wear an N95 or KN95 mask at all times while inside.

New Items We Accept

- New casual clothing for all ages, including T-shirts (short and long sleeve), sweatpants, sweatshirts, jackets, sneakers, baby clothing, coats, winter boots, leggings, socks, underwear, and athletic wear.
- Unopened hygiene essentials (hand soap, sanitizer, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, lotion, deodorant, pads, tampons, toothpaste, toothbrushes)
- Fully-assembled <u>COVID Kits</u>, <u>Welcome Baby Bags</u>, <u>Dignity Bags</u>, <u>Emergency Clothing Kits</u>, and <u>Get Set</u> <u>packages</u>
- New sheets, comforters, and towels
- New face masks (reusable or packages of disposable masks) for adults and children

Gently Used Items We Accept

T-shirts (long and short sleeve), sweaters, flannel shirts, sweatpants, sweatshirts, jackets/coats (fall-spring), winter boots (fall/winter), sneakers, shorts (spring/summer), leggings, jeans, khakis, athletic wear, baby clothes

Items We Do Not Accept

Dress shirts, dresses, business clothing, formalwear, out-ofseason clothing, used socks or underwear, items with tears, stains, missing buttons, or broken zippers, bathing suits, used bedding, toys, books, furniture, or appliances
